Responses to Submitted Questions – June 7, 2010

General Questions

Q1. Is it possible for a non-TC LHIN funded agency to apply?

Applicants must be funded by one of the Local Health Integration Networks (LHIN). This is not restricted to Toronto Central LHIN funded organizations.

Organizations not currently funded by a LHIN must be partnered with a LHIN funded organization should they wish to submit a proposal; in these situations, the lead organization must be the organization funded by the LHIN.

Q2. Is a HSIP - Supplemental Form required?

No. A HSIP Supplemental Form is not required.

Q3. Can we partner with agencies outside the Toronto Central LHIN and can we serve clients that reside both in and outside the TC LHIN?

Yes. Proposals that include cross- LHIN boundary partnerships and proposals to serve clients beyond the TC LHIN catchment are eligible under the current Calls for Proposals.

Q4. Our organization does not fit the criteria for the call, but have we have an opportunity that we would like to submit to the LHIN. Can we submit a HSIP anyway?

Yes. The Toronto Central LHIN welcomes innovative service proposals. Health service providers may submit a HSIP for services not outlined in the current Call for Proposals, at any point in time. HSIPs remain active for a one year period.

ABI Specific Questions

Q5. Can our organization apply for annualized funding under this call to augment existing support services in our partner agencies who serve the ABI community?

Yes, provided the existing support services fit the Adult Day Program model as outlined in the Call for Proposal.

The Enhanced Adult Day Program Call for proposals requires that proposals provide net new capacity.

Transitional Care Program Specific Questions

Q6. We are a seniors housing provider who would like to offer personal support services to some of our higher needs residents. Do we fit the Transitional Care Program Call for Proposals?

No. The Transitional Care Program (TCP), as outlined in the Call for Proposal is targeted at seniors who no longer require hospital inpatient services and are being transitioned to a TCP for a short period of time (60 day length of stay), before being transitioned to a subsequent appropriate destination of care. The TCP is not intended to serve as a client's discharge destination.
