

Aging at Home – Frequently Asked Questions

Q1. Can you provide an update on AAH 2010/11 Call for Proposals – what is the current status?

A1. The H-SIP submission deadline for the AAH 2010/11 Call for Proposals was noon, November 24, 2009. All H-SIP submissions were evaluated against the criteria in the Call for Proposals document.

While the original Ministry submission date of the AAH Investment Plan was January 28, 2010, the Ministry of Health and Long-Term introduced additional financial guidelines for 2010/11 AAH and extended the submission date to February 28, 2010.

The Toronto Central LHIN submitted its AAH 2010/11 Investment Plan to the Ministry on February 26, 2010 which includes:

- (i) continuation of all existing AAH projects;
- (ii) proposed expansions of existing, successful, high performing projects; and
- (iii) three new 2010/11 projects (one project from each new AAH investment stream proposed by the LHIN – Long Term Care Home Outreach Teams; Enhanced Neighbourhood Based Supportive Housing; and Enhanced Centre Based Care).

The Ministry is currently reviewing the LHIN's submissions. The LHIN expects to receive acknowledgement from the Ministry in Q1 2010/11.

Q2. How will I know if my H-SIP was included in the investment plan submission to the ministry?

A2. A letter has been sent out to all organizations that submitted H-SIPs for the AAH Year 3 Call for Proposals informing them of the status of their proposal.

Q3. If my proposal was not included in the submission to the ministry will my H-SIP remain active at the LHIN?

A3. Yes, your H-SIP will be considered during subsequent H-SIP reviews for up to one year following the date of submission.

Q4. If my proposal was shortlisted and included in the submission to the ministry – what are my next steps?

A4. The recent letter to shortlisted applicants included an update regarding action required.
